1. Desired Candidate Profile

- I. Motivated to tackle global challenges and realize sustainable cities
- II. Capable of advanced English-language study and aspiring to thrive in international settings
- III. Positive and proactive in deepening cross-cultural understanding and embracing diverse values
- IV. Eager to tackle global issues through multifaceted approaches
- V. Possessing an international perspective and capable of addressing global issues

2. Selection Process

- We offer General Selection (First Session, Second Session) and Diverse Selection (School Recommendation-Based Selection, Comprehensive Selection, Special Selection).

■ General Selection (First Session & Second Session)

◊ First Session

- Required Documents and Materials
 - ✓ Applicants are required to submit their high school transcripts and related documents.
 - ✓ Results from external English proficiency tests designated by the university are required.
 - ✓ The application requirement is expected to be: "At the time of application, applicants must have obtained a score equivalent to CEFR B1 or higher."
Note: The required score is subject to change.
- Essay (conducted in English)
- Common Test for University Admissions (scheduled for January 2028):
Applicants must take the subjects designated by the university (see *Appendix Table*).

◊ Second Session

- Required Documents and Materials
 - ✓ Applicants are required to submit their high school transcripts, a statement of purpose, and other related documents.
 - ✓ Results from external English proficiency tests designated by the university are required.
 - ✓ The application requirement is expected to be: "At the time of application, applicants must have obtained a score equivalent to CEFR B1 or higher."
Note: The required score is subject to change.
- Interview (including an oral examination, conducted in English)
- Common Test for University Admissions (scheduled for January 2028):
Applicants must take the subjects designated by the university (see *Appendix Table*).

■ School Recommendation-Based Selection

- We are planning to conduct Designated School Recommendation Admission and General Recommendation Admission.
- We are planning to require applicants to submit their high school transcripts, a letter of recommendation, a statement of purpose, and other related documents.
- ✓ Results from external English proficiency tests designated by the university are required.
- ✓ The application requirement is expected to be: "At the time of application, applicants must have obtained a score equivalent to CEFR B2 or higher."
Note: The required score is subject to change.
- The selection process includes an interview conducted in English (including an oral examination) and may also require an essay.

■ Comprehensive Selection

- We are planning to require applicants to submit their high school transcripts, a statement of purpose, and other related documents.
- ✓ Results from external English proficiency tests designated by the university are required.
- ✓ The application requirement is expected to be: "At the time of application, applicants must have obtained a score equivalent to CEFR B2 or higher."
Note: The required score is subject to change.
- The selection process is planned to be conducted in English and will include an essay and an interview (including an oral examination).

■ Special Selection

- We are planning to conduct admissions for privately financed international students.
- We are planning to require applicants to submit their high school transcripts (or academic records), a statement of purpose, and other related documents.
 - ✓ Results from external English proficiency tests designated by the university may be required.
 - ✓ The selection process is planned to be conducted in English and will include mathematics proficiency test, an essay and an interview (including an oral examination). The procedure is expected to be carried out online
 - ✓ We are planning to require applicants to submit the results of at least one standardized test designated by the university, such as International Baccalaureate (IB), SAT, ACT, etc.
- Eligible standardized test scores may be added upon the release of the guidelines. Detailed requirements will be published in the application guidelines.

Details of each selection method will be announced sequentially on the Undergraduate Admissions System Revision Page of the university website.

- If you take only one subject from Geography/History & Civics or Science, Tokyo Metropolitan University will treat that subject as the First Subject Taken, and only the First Subject Taken in Geography/History & Civics will be used for evaluation.
- For Geography/History & Civics, you cannot select both “Public Studies and Ethics” and “Public Studies and Politics & Economics” as two separate subjects.
